Landscape Design as a Process & Product

Presenter: **Gregory Pierceall**

Residential site design and development is a specialty. Come and learn the macro and micro aspects of garden and landscape design. The first part of this session will include a slide presentation outlining the design process. The second will give you hands-on experience with diagramming garden design and details.



Gregory Pierceall has been a professor of Landscape architecture for 32 years and retired from Purdue University. He is a nationally known author having written five books, *Residential Landscapes: Graphics, Planning, Design, Interiorscapes, SITESCAPES: Outdoor Rooms for Outdoor Living, and An Illustrated Guide to Landscape Design, Construction and Management*. As a lecturer, he has presented and coordinated numerous lectures including the Chicago Botanic Garden, New England Grows, Interior Plantscape Division of the Florida Nursery Growers Association and many more. Pierceall received the Association of Professional Landscape Design International Award of Distinction in 2003. Greg's emphasis in landscape design is "design not decoration" as a means of achieving functional yet attractive landscapes.
